Dignity Boxes S. Lyons, J. Zilka, H. Murdoch

What we know

- Older adults represent a large & increasing proportion of surgical patients.
- Little is known about effectively safeguarding the aging brain from peri-operative stress.
- Incidence of postoperative delirium is 20-45% among older adult surgery patients.
- Patients at high risk of post-operative delirium are likely to benefit from early re-orientation after surgery.

Following on from the successful implementation of the "Orientate Bundle" in our Trust, we have introduced Dignity Boxes...

We encourage patients to bring their spectacles, hearing aids and dentures to theatre. The Dignity Box is simply a plastic, reusable box in which theatre staff store a patient's belongings and ID sticker prior to induction of anaesthesia. The box travels with the patient to recovery where staff return their belongings promptly, enabling them to be orientated with their surroundings, hear those around them and effectively communicate.

Pilot

- Plan relayed and cascaded through theatre and recovery teams.
- Target patients: frail, trauma and laparotomy patients.
- Dignity Box recipient's details collected for review.
- Recovery staff questionnaire.

Moving Forward

- We now have 50 boxes in circulation, available to all patients.
- Theatre documentation records use of Dignity Box and contents.

Pilot Results and Observations

- Over 3 months, 178 patient labels from Dignity Boxes collected.
- 30 patients randomly selected. 23 sets of notes successfully recalled. Notes review:

- Presence of Dignity Box prompted improved documentation of patient belongings in the theatre complex.
- Potential to reduce the loss of possessions in theatres, which can be both distressing for the patient and costly for the Trust.
- Boxes not retained in theatres and lost to the wards.
- DSU staff requesting use of boxes for all patients









• Further staff education, awareness & labelling to avoid box losses.
