Enhanced Perioperative Care Guidance

CPOC was commissioned by NHSE alongside the Faculty of Intensive Care Medicine to develop guidance on '<u>Establishing and Delivering Enhanced Perioperative Care</u> <u>Services.'</u> Enhanced Perioperative Care (EPC) is a model of care for surgical patients who cannot be optimally cared for in a general ward environment but they are not expected to require Level 2 or 3 (Critical Care) interventions or staffing to meet their care needs. <u>Find out more here.</u>

Perceptions of Perioperative Care in the UK-rapid research review

CPOC has published its third in a series of rapid research reviews on the '<u>Perceptions of</u> <u>Perioperative Care in the UK</u>' that provides useful pointers for how organisations and systems could work better together. The three evidence reviews strongly make the case for perioperative care and demonstrate why it is the 'holy-grail' of healthcare.

Shared Decision Making

The GMC has published its new guidance on <u>'Decision Making and consent'</u> that must come into effect in services on the 09 November 2020. The guidance details seven principles of consent and decision making that doctors must follow and is relevant to every health and care decision that doctors make with every patient.

NHSE has released its <u>'Clinical validation of surgical waiting lists'</u> resource that details how to support patients who have been on long term surgical waiting lists. Most of these patients will have agreed to undergo operative treatment before the pandemic started, therefore many peoples circumstances may have changed due to a number of factors. Shared decision making is vital when determining the next steps in the patients perioperative journey.
