Welcome CPOC's Shared Decision Making Virtual Hub!

With the current surgical backlog, it is imperative we ensure the right patient undergoes the right surgery. Up to 14% of patients regret having undergone surgery, and previous Cochrane reviews suggests implementing shared decision making reduces the number of patients who choose major surgical interventions.

Ensuring patients make informed choices has recently been the focus of new <u>GMC</u> and <u>NICE</u> <u>guidance</u>, and there are now a vast number of resources to help patients and clinicians arrive at decisions in partnership. At CPOC, we have collated this into one hub.

This hub contains a range of resources such as short podcasts, education and training packages, suggested quality improvement projects and national guidance. We hope we ignite your interest in implementing or furthering shared decision making in your context. This is simply a start and we

The 3rd Sprint National Anaesthesia Project (SNAP 3) Studying Frailty and Delirium

The 3rd Sprint National Anaesthesia Project (SNAP 3), studying frailty and delirium, has taken the difficult decision to change our recruitment period to 21st-25th March 2022. This is due to COVID related challenges for local regulatory approvals and concerns about increasing clinical pressures on anaesthetic departments. We have taken this decision after discussion with RAFT, who support moving our recruitment dates.

SNAP 3 will describe the epidemiology of the growing issues of frailty and postoperative delirium. We will look at the relationships between frailty, multi-morbidity and delirium and evaluate how these conditions affect individuals outcomes.

Peri-operative care of Older People undergoing Surgery (POPS) Network

This new approach to the peri-operative management of older people undergoing surgery has been developed by leading clinicians in the field over the last 17 years, with extremely good results. The POPS service has improved outcomes by integrating geriatricians into the care pathway of older surgical patients and demonstrates that preoperative Comprehensive Geriatric Assessment (CGA) and optimisation reduces postoperative complications and length of stay in older people undergoing elective orthopaedic and vascular surgery.

There is now a bold ambition to share this work and drive the adoption and spread of this service model across the NHS.
